




# Time Change November 6<sup>th</sup>

# **Mission Highlights**

"Go also the second mile" Matthew 5:41

Help support the Veterans! Early November, we will be collecting stockings for homeless veterans though the I Support the 1% Veterans Food Pantry. Stockings may be filled with basic need/hygiene items, as well as goodies or comfort items (word searches/puzzle books, etc) and Christmas cards or notes of cheer. You can pick up a stocking and a list of suggested items from the front table to fill and return. Since these stockings are distributed to veterans locally, there are no shipping-related restrictions. Collections will run through **November 6th.** Please help us to spread some holiday cheer to those veterans in need!

In mid-November watch the bulletins for the notice that the Angel Tree Project will begin. As a church we purchase Christmas gifts for those children who have a parent or guardian in the jail system. These gifts must be back to church by **December 11** so that they can be delivered to the children by our members in December.

The mission committee is also continuing to collect Meijer, Target, Amazon, and Walmart gift cards (or cash donations) through the month of November to support refugees resettled to Michigan. There is a collection box set up in the front hallway; donations may also be dropped off at the church office (Please label your donation for "Refugee Mission."). Any donations made to this mission project will be matched up to \$500 by the mission committee. The liaison of this collection will be St. Vincent Catholic Charities ("STVCC"), which is working directly with refugee families in the area. Refugees resettling in the area have a desperate need for hands-on resources including housing, furniture, transports.



desperate need for hands-on resources including housing, furniture, transportation, employment assistance, school orientation, education in the English language, medical services, counseling, and legal aid. STVCC has the infrastructure in place to assist refugees in settling into their new homes. The gift cards will assist refugees in obtaining tangible items: shoes/boots, cleaning supplies, household goods, laundry supplies, linens, some furniture items, kitchen items, etc. If you would like more information on the mission that we are supporting, including the specific needs and the process of resettlement, please visit the St. Vincent Catholic Charities website link, <a href="https://stvcc.org/services/refugee-services/">https://stvcc.org/services/refugee-services/</a>. The information there includes a breakdown of countries from where refugees arrive, reasons why people become refugees, the specific needs being addressed, and much more.


#### **Give Online!**

button. You can use this for one-time giving, or to set up recurring giving! Thank you for your gifts to Second Presbyterian Church!






#### **Snow Removal**
