



160th Anniversary

This year, February 7, 2024 marks the 160th anniversary of Second Presbyterian Church. Here is a little history: On January 24, 1864, 17 men and women gathered at McLellan School (later to become White School), at what is now State and Midland Roads. These individuals came together under the leadership of Reverend J. A. Griffes, a Presbyterian clergyman, to discuss the formation of a church. They signed a request to organize into a church "upon condition that a sufficient number should be found

willing to unite together as a Christian church". Two weeks later the same group met at the Ure School and officially formed the First Presbyterian Society of Saginaw Township, the predecessor of our Second Presbyterian Church.



We will have a Lenten Bible Study based on the book *Pause: Spending Lent with the Psalms* by Elizabeth Caldwell. She introduces this book as follows:

The culture in which we are embedded doesn't invite or encourage us to pause, to lay aside our perpetual activity. It seems that we are always rushing to the next thing. Pausing is truly countercultural. Think of Lent as a refreshing pause in your life to nourish your soul. As you read the psalm of the week, you'll begin to see how an ancient poem/hymn can connect with your own life and circumstances. You will also explore new ways to nurture your life of faith during the Lenten season.

This Lenten Bible Study will be held on the following five Thursdays: February 22 & 29, March 7, 14, & 21. Participants are invited to bring a snack to share and come at 6:45 pm for a time of fellowship leading up to the Bible Study which will begin around 7:00 pm. You do not need to purchase or read the book. Each week, there will be a lesson based on one chapter of the book and then a time of reflection and discussion. A different Psalm and theme will be explored each week, so it does not matter if you miss one of the lessons. All are invited to come and take this time to pause during the Lenten season.

Director of Music Ministry



We are pleased to announce that after several months of searching, Thomas Heidenreich will be joining us as our new Director of Music Ministry. He will be moving here from Wisconsin and should be joining us around the first of March. He will be serving at both First and Second Presbyterian Churches. Thomas recently completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music.
