As fewer people use boxes of offering envelopes, we will place articles in the newsletter if there are special envelopes in the offering boxes. The special envelope for January is the Per Capita envelope. Per Capita is part of being a Presbyterian and connecting to the Presbyterian Church as a whole; it is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. The total 2022 Per Capita for our church is \$8,207.00, which equates to **\$29.00 per member** (not per household). This goes to General Assembly, Synod of the Covenant, and the Presbytery. If each member pays their Per Capita amount above their regular giving, then pressure on our budget is reduced. Please mark Per Capita on your check or envelope.

All women of the church are invited to join us on Wednesday, January 12 at 9:30 a.m. as we gather for fellowship and fun.


PNC Update

Collin Whitfield has served as Director of Music Ministries at First Presbyterian Church of Saginaw since 2018. He is excited to begin a new chapter at Second Presbyterian Church, even as he continues his music ministries at First Presbyterian. An award-winning composer, organist, and pianist, Collin was recognized in the May 2021 issue of *The Diapason* as one of the twenty leaders under the age of 30 for his technical achievements and creativity in the fields of organ and church music. He frequently composes music for worship and his compositions have received awards including the James Highsmith Award for new orchestral music, first prize in the American Choral Directors Association Choral Composition Competition through Central Michigan, and first prize in the Biennial Art Song Composition Competition at SF Conservatory. Collin holds a Master of Music degree in organ performance from Central Michigan University, where he studied with Dr. Steven Egler. He received his Bachelor of Music from San Francisco Conservatory of Music, where he studied with notable composers David Conte and Mason Bates. Please give Collin a warm Second Pres welcome.

Presbytery Personnel Update

At its December 7 Stated Meeting, the Presbytery of Lake Huron voted to dissolve the ministry relationship with Executive Presbyter Dan Saperstein, effective December 31, per a negotiated agreement. Although Dan remains in good standing in ministry and as a member of Presbytery, in accordance with our separation ethics policy, after December 31 and for a period of one year, he will not be available to perform any ministry functions in the Presbytery without the prior authorization of the Commission on Ministry and Ministry Preparation.
