

Dear Friends. As March begins, we continue our Lenten journey. We

reflect on what it meant for Jesus to be heading to the cross. We consider what he suffered for us and our salvation. It is a time to evaluate our lives, to repent of sins, and to recommit to faithfully following Christ. But before this month is through, this journey takes us to the excitement of Palm Sunday, the sacredness of Maundy Thursday as Jesus gathered his disciples around him for that Last Supper, the solemnness of Good Friday as Jesus hung on the cross and died for our

sins, and then the joy and hope of Easter morning as Jesus rose from the dead.

We take this journey ever year. By now, you probably know exactly what to expect. The palm branches will be out on March 24. In the services on March 28 and 29, we will sing familiar hymns such as O Sacred Head, Now Wounded. On March 31, we expect the sanctuary to be filled with extra people and the fragrance of lilies. We know how it all goes. Perhaps it has even started to feel monotonous to you.

But imagine how it must have felt for those early followers of Jesus. Imagine their shock at what was unfolding. Were they fearful? Confused? Appalled? Disheartened, but trying to cling to any shred of hope they could find? What sort of conversations did they have with one another? How did they pray during this time? What did they believe was possible? What did they understand as to why this was all happening?

I encourage you to take some time to reflect on these questions. Try to imagine yourself as one of those early followers of Christ. Let us not just go through the motions as we continue this Lenten journey. This is such a meaningful time. It is my prayer that each one of us would be drawn closer to God as we continue this season of Lent. And then, let us joyfully gather together on Easter morning to celebrate our risen Lord!

**THANK YOU** to the congregation for your ongoing support to the missions of Second Presbyterian Church. So far for 2024, we have been able to raise \$305.84 to fight hunger both locally and abroad through the "Two Coins a Meal" mission, and we have collected numerous hygiene and personal care items for the Saginaw Rescue Mission "Operation Hope and Care Totes." These collections will truly make an impact in our community and allow us to share God's love to those in need.



For the month of March, our mission focus will be the Old Town Baby Pantry. The pantry helps parents who need a hand with items for their new babies. We will have a crib set up in the hallway to accept any items that would be useful to new babies. Some suggested items include sleepers, onesies, outfits, snowsuits/jackets (all size 0-12 months), crib sheets,

receiving blankets, hooded towels, wash cloths bibs, bottles, newborn diapers, wipes, diaper bags, shampoo/baby wash, baby powder, lotions, bassinets, pack-n-plays, highchairs, bouncy seats. We will be

collecting items through March 31st.

We need members to join our Green Team. Joining the team would mean mowing, trimming, blowing the grass off the sidewalks all using the equipment we have at the Church. If you are interested, please sign up on the sheet in the gathering area or call the church office @ 792-1023.
