

Building Maintenance Fund

The Building Maintenance Fund was established to ensure costly capital repairs wouldn't negatively impact the budget. Over the years, folks have given generously to the Building Maintenance Fund. In the last three years, the roofs over Fellowship Hall, the Sanctuary, and the Gathering Area/Sunday School have been replaced at the cost \$96,950. This was paid mostly from the funds in the Building Maintenance Fund (the Presbyterian Men also contributed) and will result in the fund's depletion. Thanks to your generosity, we have been able to make these costly repairs without worrying about the financial impact on our programs.

The Finance Committee is asking the congregation to prayerfully consider a special donation to replenish the Building Fund from now through the end of the year. Since July we've received almost \$6,200.00 to help replenish this fund. Thank you for your generosity.

General Assembly ministries for Presbyterian Peacemaking Programs.

Mission News "Go the Second Mile" Matthew 5:4

Thank you to the congregation for your support of the school-supply drive! This year, Brethren was blessed with an outpouring of local donations, and has requested that we share the items we collected with another local school. Thanks to the numerous items we received, we were able to show support to THREE local schools: Carrolton, Arthur Eddy Academy, and Merrill Park Elementary. All three schools are very appreciative of your support in helping their children in need. We were able to collect 492 items. Special thank-you to Gerry Brown and Linda Mattson for delivering the items to these three schools! We are continuing to collect winterwear for the school children as well throughout the rest of the year, as we know winter-weather will be here before we know it!



For September, the mission focus will be "It's All About the Cross," the ministry serving the Saginaw County Jail. Chaplain Andy Cox, (Formerly of Forgotten Man Ministries) is continuing to collect books and bibles to provide to inmates at the Saginaw County Jail. Our mission focus collection will be books for this ministry. Books must be soft cover, and with a positive theme, inspirational/self-help books, or literature encouraging inmates to grow in their faith. They may also accept puzzle books or magazines, such

as crosswords or word-searches They are unable to accept hard cover books, books with stapled bindings, or books with themes of romance, crime/thriller, or violent themes including those about war. In addition to any books collected, we will also be donating bibles to the ministry to help in their outreach to those in the jail.
